#### E.76 - 10.17 APOLOGIES

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs D Baker, R Barnes, A Crowe, K Francis and J Simpson.

#### E.77 - 10.17 DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS

There were no interests declared at this point in the meeting.

#### E.78 - 10.17 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

A member of the public commented that young people do want a shelter at the recreation ground and would be happy to talk to councillors about their opinions. The Chairman thanked him for his comments and said that as it was not an agenda item, the matter would not be discussed at the meeting.

#### E.79 - 10.17 MINUTES

 Members clarified the following omissions/corrections in the draft Minutes of the Environment & Leisure Committee meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> September, 2017, copies having been previously circulated, and considered any action required:

Referring to E.64-09.17- Public Participation - A local resident had highlighted an inaccuracy in a comment attributed to him in the first paragraph.

## RESOLVED: To delete the following text "... with the brick wall requiring maintenance".

Referring to E.66, 5.1, - Cemetery - The Clerk sought clarification as to whether a quotation for works to trees had been considered and decided upon. Members recalled that a separate vote had been taken at the Full Council meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 to approve the works. The Clerk was instructed to put the works in hand.

Referring to E.69-09.17, 3 - Dog Hill Wood – members confirmed that the resolution had been amended at the Full Council meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> September to read '....residents **be asked to** part fund the cost'.

Referring to E.72-09.17, - Working Parties and Task & Finish Groups -The Clerk sought clarification on the approval of the reports and any recommendations contained within. Reports from the Christmas Lights meetings held on 5 July, 25<sup>th</sup> July and 7<sup>th</sup> August had been noted.

### **RESOLVED:** To approve and adopt the reports as presented.

The Clerk advised that there was no Minute relating to Correspondence. The Chairman confirmed that there had been no items of correspondence brought to the Committee's attention at the meeting.

## **RESOLVED:** That a Minute be included under the heading 'Correspondence'.

#### E.80 - 10.17 BUDGET 2018/19

Members were advised that a request had been received for a memorial bench in the Cemetery.

#### E.82 - 10.17 DOG HILL WOOD

Members noted correspondence from a local resident regarding further incidents of antisocial behaviour/vandalism in the cricket pitch area of Dog Hill Wood in that the waste bin had again been ripped from its base and thrown down the slope.

Members considered three quotations for a replacement 'anti- vandal' bin.

# RESOLVED: To recommend the purchase of a hooded steel heavy duty bin (option 2) in the sum of £404.99 plus VAT.

#### E.83 - 10.17 GROUNDS MAINTENANCE

The contract for the Town Council's various amenity areas expires on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. Members recognised the good work of the contractor whilst being mindful of the Operational Review (refer paras 5.1.7, 5.1.8 and 5.4.4) recommendation to consider the benefit of bringing the work inhouse. The Clerk advised that a cost benefit comparison was being worked-up to aid decision making in this regard.

Following discussion, it was

RESOLVED: That the Council be recommended to extend the Grounds Maintenance contract until 30 November 2018.
