P130.-12-18 APOLOGIES were received from Councillors Low, Roberts and

P130.-12–18 INTERESTS: none were declared other than Cllr Whattler noting

that he has objected to the proposal for 400 houses.

P131,-12-18 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mr Paul Kinnaird wished to draw attention to application 184032 and the previous 174495. He has been in correspondence with Roland Close who concludes that the application is invalid under the Town & Country Planning Order. He quoted three points which are particularly pertinent to the current scheme:

- 1.The proposal represents disproportionate growth that undermines the spatial strategy of the Herefordshire Local Plan Core Strategy 2011-2031
- 2. The proposal would harm the character and appearance of the countryside / landscape contrary to the provisions of the Herefordshire Local Plan Core Strategy 2011-2031.
- 3.The proposal is considered contrary to key objectives of the NPPF in demonstrating a sustainable location which encourages and promotes the use of sustainable travel modes.

P132.-12-18 PRESENTATION BY NANCY WINFIELD, project manager for HCCLH.

Nancy Winfield outlined the central government initiative under which Herefordshire has received just over half a million pounds to look at the kind of housing needed in the community – to be created and controlled by the local community. She advised that there is advice and capital funding available from HCCLH and proposed having a meeting in Ledbury next year to guage if there is interest in taking this forward.

Cllr Harvey in referring to the adoption of Ledbury's Neighbourhood Plan and the forthcoming review of the core strategy, suggested that it might be useful for the council to work in a more coordinated way with HCCLH in order to include more firm proposals for community housing.

Ms Winfield offered to forward details of policies that can be included to the Clerk.

P136.-12-18 LEDBURY NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Councillor Shields, who had chaired two meetings, summarised that the one held on 21 November 2018 had been principally concerned with the vote on 6 December when it was agreed that Sam Banks be invited to join the meeting on 10 December; this was largely concerned with the key issue of the settlement boundary and caution was urged in view of the forthcoming elections in May and the core strategy review which is not likely to commence until August 2019. The need for robust evidence was stressed.

It was hoped that there would be an opportunity for members of the working party to talk to people working on the core strategy and also that as many people as appropriate from the town plan working group be included.

P137.-12-18 TOWN PLAN WORKING GROUP

Councillor Shields reported that this group sees itself as independent of the council and would like to remain that way. It is essentially a networking group with a coordinating role and would like to see the town council taking a more active role in implementing the town plan.

P138.-12-18 TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT WORKING PARTY

The working party had had its first meeting under the chairmanship of Cllr Howells. It aims to take a whole-town approach to traffic management. Cllr Howells will be talking to stakeholders to identify key areas of work.

P139.-12-18 CORRESPONDENCE

There had been correspondence about the closure of Storesbrook Bridge which will now remain open over the Christmas period, with closure in early 2019.

With regard to weight restrictions on Falcon Lane it had been decided not to progress at present but Cllr Howells suggested the situation be reviewed by the Traffic Management working party.
