> RAWDON JAMES COOK is buried in ESQUELMES WAR CEMETERY Belgium

The British Expeditionary Force was involved in the later stages of the defence of Belgium following the German invasion in May 1940, and suffered many casualties in covering the withdrawal to Dunkirk. Those buried in Esquelmes War Cemetery died in defending the line of the River Scheldt; the Germans attempted to cross the river near Esquelmes during the morning of 21 May, but were replused after heavy fighting. The cemetery contains 233 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War.

Rawdon James Cook is buried in Plot IV. Row A Grave 7.3.
