MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR, COUNCILLOR D VESMA

As a natural hugger, I was delighted when the Government announced that we will be permitted to use our common-sense about hugging our loved ones.

It was when reflecting on this new freedom that I considered those for whom the past year's lack of physical contact was not actually that unusual, and who do not receive the affirmation of warm embraces from family and friends on a regular basis. As we finally appear to be making progress against this dreadful illness, please do give a thought, a wave and, if appropriate, a hug to someone that really needs it. Random good wishes between strangers have actually been something of a highlight of recent weeks for me. Watching the impromptu and spontaneous conversations being held at tables beneath the Market House. People joking, comparing sandwiches, and petting each other's dogs is starting to feel normal again. I'm really chuffed that we have been able to provide this facility for tourists and locals alike and am grateful to our staff who set them up each day.

It is also great to welcome back so many pubs, cafes, restaurants, and retailers to the town; I trust Ledbury to stay sensible and to remain situationally aware as the rules are relaxed. If we all continue to respect the personal space of others in shops and the street, then I am hopeful that the worst is past us. I must also acknowledge the hard work of those continuing to deliver vaccinations at astonishing pace to our citizens. I must mention my disappointment at the Secretary of State's decision to permit the single access at the Viaduct development site. I believe this to be a short-sighted, politicised decision which puts commercial profits ahead of the people of Ledbury. So many on the Council poured their hearts and souls into defending the town against this ill-advised approach, but if as I fear this is now a done-deal, attention must turn to making sure that the residents of the new houses are welcomed into our community with open arms, and that support is given to the local public services which will need to accommodate them.

He would like to thank the Town Clerk, Angie Price, for her invaluable help in navigating the complicated, and at times arcane structures of the council's finances and policies, as well as all the other office staff for their consistent friendliness, professionalism, and willingness to help on all his visits to the council offices. Councillor Eakin would also like to thank his deputy chair, Cllr. Howells, and all members of the Finance, Policy and General Purposes Committee, for maintaining a civil, productive, and friendly atmosphere at meetings, and bringing the range of knowledge, experience and perspectives necessary for local democracy to function.

Ledbury Town Council wants to hear your views on the future of our neighbourhood

In mid-June all residents of Ledbury Parish will receive a questionnaire and leaflet asking for their views on how the town should develop over the next few years.

The purpose is a public consultation on a partial revision of Ledbury's Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), limited to a small number of topics which were not fully covered in the existing plan. A key question will be whether there should be a settlement boundary and where it should be. A settlement boundary can direct development to those areas where local people would like to see development happen. Residents are being asked for their views on where new employment and sports facilities should be located and how the town centre should change. We also want to know what people think about the countryside around Ledbury, the green spaces within the town and whether the plan should have policies to protect and increase biodiversity and wildlife.

Everyone 16 or over is invited to respond, preferably online (see the Council's NDP website for the link), but also in paper form for those without internet access.

We would also like residents to tell us about the views and landscape they love in the neighbourhood by sending us photographs with some words about why the view or landscape matters to them. Submissions should be sent to the Town Council, preferably by email to clerk@ledburytowncouncil.gov.uk or by post to Ledbury Town Council Offices, Church Street, Ledbury, HR8 1DH .Submissions should reach the Council by Wednesday 30th June.

The Charter Market, run by the Town Council, is a twice-weekly retail market held in the Ledbury High Street and under the Market House. The market is held every Tuesday and Saturday, except on a Tuesday in October due to the annual Mop Fair).

The historical market has run since 1584 in Ledbury and comprises of approximately 12 stalls. We offer one stall free to charities.

The market offers a wide range of produce including food (meat, fish, fruit and vegetables, cheese, bread, cakes) and clothes, shoes, bags, jewellery, watches, Flowers, and plants.

16TH CENTURY PAINTED ROOM

We had hoped to be allowed to re-open the 16th Century Painted Room on the 12th of April when government guidelines allowed the re-opening of retail, but sadly were not permitted to do so until the 17th of May. In the meantime we decided to set up temporary information boards about the history of Ledbury under the Market House, so that visitors to the town who were unable to access any of the historic buildings, would have some of the town's history available to read about. Since re-opening a fortnight ago our visitor numbers have been steadily growing after a rather quiet start during the first week! As ever, it varies enormously day to day. We are also pleased to see that more visitors are now carrying cash instead of contactless cards only, which means that sales and donations have been much better this year so far than during 2020.

We are continuing to operate under the same Covid-19 safe system that we put in place last July. Visitors enter through the first door on the left in Church Lane, where we take track and trace contact details, or they register on the NHS app. There is a waiting area with information boards about the Market House. Tours of the wall paintings are every 15 minutes from 11.00a.m. to 1.00p.m. and 2.00p.m. to 4.00p.m. Monday to Thursday and Saturdays. You can just turn up and wait for the next available tour or book ahead by contacting tourguides@ledburytowncouncil.gov.uk. Numbers are currently limited to 10 per group. Masks are required unless you are exempt. To help us maintain social distancing, visitors are leaving via the back door onto Church Street. We are currently unable to offer tours of the Market House but hope to resume these on request if the regulations are lifted on 21st June as we all hope. We are currently looking for a Saturday tour guide or assistant. For details see elsewhere in the newsletter or on the council website.

We have a range of souvenir items that you might like to consider as gifts, including postcards, china mugs, bags etc. Do come and take a look, our range is currently on display in the Town Council Office window.

We look forward to welcoming all our visitors, old and new, during the season. Entry is free, but please remember that we rely heavily on donations and take cash only and do not have card facilities.

Councillors and Staff at Ledbury Town Council are delighted with how popular the outdoor seating has been, particularly as the warm weather and sun make a most certainly welcomed appearance.

After much discussion, the Council are looking into developing the outdoor seating to benefit the community further, like schemes to tackle loneliness in Ledbury. One idea is something we like to call 'friends' hour', where people can share tables and make new acquaintances. This could mean a lot to somebody who has been self-isolating alone for the past year.

The Council are also grateful for those who take advantage of the seating area and keep it clean for the next user.

The seating area will be under the Market House every Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9:30am to 3:00pm. Keep an eye out for our hanging baskets around the Market House, they should be delivered soon.



THE KNIFE ANGEL - HEREFORD

Knife Angel Visit to Hereford Cathedral – 14 June to 12 July

The Knife Angel will be situated outside the West End of Hereford Cathedral from 14 June to 12 July. The sculpture is 27ft tall, it weighs 3.5 ton and is made out of 100,000 confiscated knives received from 43 Police Forces across the UK. It originated from The British Ironwork Centre in Oswestry and took sculptor Alfie Bradley over two years to construct. It has been on tour round the UK and has become a national monument against violence and aggression in all its forms. Not only does the Angel act as a catalyst for turning the tide on violent and aggressive behaviour, but it is also acts as a beautiful memorial designed to celebrate those lives who have been lost through these violent and thoughtless actions.



Inside both the cathedral and Hereford Library, there will be boards displaying work carried out in response to the Knife Angel by children and young people. The project team will also share work via social media. Hereford City Youth Council have also arranged a series of workshop events throughout the month including creative arts and self-defence coaching.

The knife angel creators would like as many young people as possible to become anti-violence champions and have created an anti-violence certificate as a thank you to all young people who stand up to violence. There will be printed copies of the certificate available at the Knife Angel for those who visit.
