THE MAYORS UPDATE

The Mayor has many formal invites on a regular basis and the new year since the last newsletter has been no exception. Joining Herefordshire's High Sheriff, Sarah Rohan, with lead organiser Griff Holliday at Ledbury's Big Breakfast was a brilliant celebration of what Ledbury has to offer in culinary excellence, but a visit to the Ledbury Food bank on the day was an education in the wide range of services they now offer to those needing help and a stark reminder of how fortunate most of us are not to need it.

In quick succession I was delighted to accept an invitation to join The Friends of Ledbury Church at their Burns Night Supper, attended the Herefordshire's Armed Forces Covenant Partnership (which the council signed up to in 2019) Annual Review for 2022 and Breakfast Networking Event, and then hosted a Mayor's Valentine's Day Coffee Morning beautifully organised with suitable decor for the occasion by our dedicated council office staff. We were honoured to have the presence of one of our local Deputy Lieutenants, Nat Hone, and the Chair of Herefordshire Council, Cllr Sebastian Bowen, to meet and talk with residents who shared coffee and appropriately decorated cakes.

	Community Speed Watch is coming to Ledbury.
SCHEDULE OF EVENTS	Ledbury Town Council have voted to support a local Community Speed Watch scheme in Ledbury. Community Speed Watch (CSW) schemes are coordinated by the police but managed and run by volunteers in the community. The
WARM SPACES	scheme enables local people to take an active role in road safety and make our community safer. The aim of CSW is to encourage motorists to drive at a safe and appropriate speed, reduce speed in areas of concern such as near schools, re-educate drivers about the dangers of speeding and address concerns from local residents about cars speeding through their neighbourhood. At specified safe locations, volunteers monitor the speed of passing vehicles with a
LEDBURY FOOD BANK	handheld speed detection device. Offending vehicles' details are recorded on a log sheet, the make/model and registration number of the vehicle and the speed recorded by the handheld device. Log sheets are submitted to West Mercia Police and warning letters are sent to the registered keepers with advice on safer driving. Before a scheme can be established Ledbury, we will need to recruit a Co-ordinator and at least six volunteers. Schemes are open to anyone aged 17 or over. Volunteers will only be accepted onto a scheme once appropriate checks have been carried out.



Finance, Policy & General Purpose

The Planning; Economic Development and Tourism committee, as it is now known, has continued to question all planning applications and approve those that will enhance the town and not support applications that contravene planning laws. We are concerned that the old Methodist church application was not supported and are asking Hereford for a discussion to move this on. The committee works hard to achieve our goals and Cllr Sims is now chairing the Tourism working party. Its first meeting was well attended and a lot of positive discussion was had. If any one thinks they could help, working parties encourage traders and the good folk of the town to join.

I hope my fellow councillors on this committee will stand again for election and then continue to improve the town and its future. There is a planning application No. To build more than 50 units behind the large house.

The Knapp, opposite the petrol station on the Homend. This is an extraordinary plot of land, full of bio diversity and the application has received a great number of OBJECTIONS from the public as well as the Council.

Environment & Leisure In the last few months, the Finance, Policy and General Purposes Committee have continued to ensure day-to-day monitoring of the Council's accounts and the scrutiny of all expenditure. The Committee also completed a budget process for the next financial year and were able to recommend to Full Council a budget for 2023-24 including a recommendation on the levying of the Precept by the Town Council.

The Precept is a tax that town and parish councils charge their local electors to meet their budget requirements. Town and Parish Councils do not receive any direct funding from central government and rely on their Precept plus any other income they generate from services or facilities they provide. Our Town Council Precept is part of the Council Tax and is collected from local electors via their Herefordshire County Council Tax payments.

Given the financially-tight times for the year ahead we had no wish to make even greater demands on residents' household expenses. We kept any increase in costs to a bare minimum - well below the headline inflation rate - whilst still being able to pay our bills; particularly increases in our 'big ticket' items of salaries and insurance; and the running and maintenance costs of our historic buildings.

The scope of the Environment and Leisure Committee's work includes the care of the Recreation Ground, the Town Cemetery, the Dog Wood, and the general condition of the Town Centre. We are very pleased that this work is shared with a number of volunteer groups, and are grateful for their efforts to maintain our lovely town. Now that the balustrade at Top Cross has been replaced, the planters will soon be a thing of beauty once again!

A number of trees are being planted by the Council; in the Walled Garden, the River Walk and the Recreation Ground, for example. And the ivy which has been causing problems with the Cemetery wall has been removed. Several trees in Dog Wood have been identified as presenting a risk, and officers are working to ensure these are felled in the near future. Several new litter bins have been installed, and new cradle swing seats in the playground are on order.

The spirit of volunteering, which the King hopes will be very much in evidence over the Coronation weekend, is alive and well in Ledbury. When civic budgets are under so much pressure it is good that so much can be achieved through the work of local volunteers, clearing litter, tidying the Town Trail and planting flowers and shrubs in public places.


Neighbourhood Plan update

The revised Ledbury NDP, having been approved by Herefordshire Council to proceed to the independent examination stage, has been with the examiner since early in the New Year. The NDP website on the Town Council site has been fully updated with all the latest files for the Examiner and interested parties to explore.

The Examiner's report is expected towards the end of February or early March, in which it is hoped that a proposed settlement boundary, land for employment off the Little Marcle Road and a proposed location for a new football facility, and green infrastructure with proposed enhancement zones, will be accepted. As it is, having gone through two rounds of public consultation, the plan already carries some weight in planning application decisions.

Once received, any recommended edits to the plan will be implemented and the document then submitted back to Herefordshire Council for approval to go to a public referendum for it to be adopted. Due to the pre-election period ahead of the Local Council elections in May, it is anticipated that a referendum will take place shortly after the election in early May following which, if confirmed by a majority responding, it is anticipated that the plan could be formally adopted during June 2023.



Delivering support for those over 50 who have concerns about their physical, financial and mental wellbeing, our services have never been more in demand. Sonia, our Information and Advice Officer is based in The Master's House and can offer a range of support according to your needs. Following an initial chat on the phone, she will organise an appointment if necessary.

From April 2021 to April 2022, we supported 118 older people to draw down £126k in benefits in the Ledbury area, totalling 1157 contacts with local service users. As part of the Household Support Fund, we will be offering free home energy checks and warm home packs to eligible Ledbury residents over the winter months to increase energy efficiency and offer additional support to access grant funding to ensure that Ledbury residents are warm and comfortable.

We are also excited to announce that Keith, our Sheds Together Ledbury Coordinator, is working hard to find a location for the project, so please let us know if you know of any land or workshop space so that we can get started in Ledbury. We have already opened in two locations in Bromyard, and have a base for our Leominster Shed, so any idea/support would be gratefully received.

Ledbury Food Bank - Here to Help




Ledbury Food bank has experienced an unprecedented increase in demand for its services this year and had exceeded the number of visitors it had in 2021 by the end of September.


In addition to providing emergency food parcels visitors can access advice on benefits, housing and debt problems and has recently been awarded almost £25,000 form the government's Household Support Fund which will be used to provide additional support to Herefordshire residents.

The food bank is open each Wednesday and Friday morning between 10.00am and 12.00pm and Thursday evening between 6.00pm and 8.00pm.
