1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Heather Coppock.

2 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor Shields declared an interest as Chairman of Sustainable Ledbury and the Ledbury Library Development Group. Councillor Morris also declared an interest in Ledbury Library Development Group.

TO APPROVE AND SIGN, AS A CORRECT RECORD, THE MINUTES OF THE EVENTS WORKING PARTY MEETING HELD ON 3 MAY 2023.

That the minutes of the Events Working Party meeting held on 3 May 2023 be approved and signed as a correct record.

To note Item 11 was taken as the first event discussion at the meeting – however it appears as Item 11 in the Minutes.

5 HERITAGE OPEN DAYS (HODS) – 8 to 17 September 2023

The CDO circulated a paper on progress to date, which included the potential for funding for the Sealed Knot and their attendance at the events.

It was agreed that a one day Living History Camp be progressed by the CDO, supported potentially by an evening Hog Roast at the Recreation Ground.

Ledbury Morris Dancers to be approached by CDO for a daytime event.

Beth Hughes advised the Working Party members that she was trying to find cover, paid or unpaid to enable the Painted Room and the Market House to be

open during the week of the HOD's as unfortunately she was not available for either weekend. However, it is hoped that the Painted Room can be opened for one weekend subject to getting support from other staff/volunteers.

To note the Heritage Centre would be open as normal during the week. i.e. Thursday and Friday 10:30 – 14:30 Saturday and Sunday 10:30 – 16:30

Educational visits for Junior and Senior evening events could take place in the Heritage Centre (Old Grammar School) on the Upper Floor or in Panelled room in Masters House, subject to availability.

As part of the educational aspects, it was noted that Hannah Day may be able to run a workshop revamping old material for new ideas, children can dress up in period costumes and it is hoped that there may also be a Spinner in the lobby; all details to be confirmed on the Heritage Centre website. Members noted that Christine Tustin may organise a tourist heritage trail.

It was noted that all events had to be separately registered with the HODs website – this was one of the event's rules for insurance purposes. It was noted that Ledbury Places had already signed up.

It was noted that it would be useful for the Working Group to propose a budget provision for 2023/24 for advertising. It was suggested that the budget provision should be based on 3 x double page entries per annum within the Focus magazine at a cost of £390 per 2 pages plus VAT, totalling £1,170 plus VAT per annum (assumed at current rates). This would allow the Working Party sufficient time to place advertising material in the Focus for three main events throughout the year although it appreciated, where possible, sponsorship should be sought to minimise the impact on the budget.

RESOLVED:

- 1 The CDO and Al Braithwaite to discuss options for the educational visits.
- The CDO is to approach the Ledbury Morris Dancers to see if they would be available for a daytime event.
- The Tour Guide Manager is to advise the CDO on what cover to be provided for the event and when.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- The Sealed Knot attendance as a one day Living History Camp supported by a Hog Roast on the Recreation Ground to be recommended to Environment & Leisure Committee for funding. The CDO to secure the Sealed Knot presence.
- Members of the Events Working Party agreed to hire Merchants House Musicians to play on Friday, 15 September and Saturday, 16 September 2023 at a cost of £200 (plus parking fee) and

recommend the same to Environment & Leisure for funding approval.

The Events Working Party are to seek approval from the Environment & Leisure Committee to agree on an advertising budget for £1,170 plus VAT for three double pages in the Focus for 2023/24.

6 CORONATION EVENT

A report was presented to the meeting confirming the final arrangements in readiness for the Coronation Event on 8 May 2023.

RESOLVED:

That the report was received and noted.

7 COMMUNITY DAY – 10 JUNE 2023

Griff Holliday informed the meeting that there had been 40 positive responses from groups across the town coming together with a "Green Sustainable" focus.

Any other groups would be most welcome to join. There would be postings on the Council website in readiness.

8 CELEBRATION DAY – 9 JULY 2023

Griff Holliday reported that bookings were progressing slowly with a need for a greater number of food providers. Work was progressing with musical groups to provide a presence at the event.

The CDO was working with Griff Holliday on logistics for the day including putting up and taking down the LTC gazeboes.

9 LEDBURY CARNIVAL - 28 AUGUST 2023

Jill Jupp presented a report to the meeting, a copy of which is attached.

10 LEDBURY POETRY FESTIVAL - 30 JUNE TO 9 JULY 2023

Hannah Bergough-Sutton advised the members that the Festival Programme was now online, with priority bookings for "Friends" now open. The brochure and programme would be circulated around the town later this week.

11 GREAT BIG GREEN WEEK - 10 TO 18 JUNE 2023

The CDO presented a report on the activities identified to date including a programme of litter picks, including help from Ledbury Primary School. It is hoped that all litter pick groups can take photos of rubbish collected so that it can then be transformed into a collage. A coffee morning event will be organised to include a swap shop. There will be window displays by the local traders and potentially a cookery demonstration to illustrate food miles.

It was noted that the Herefordshire Council CDO would be working with the Town Council to support the week's activities.

Activities may tend to fall on Saturday (10th), Sunday (11th), Tuesday (13th) and the following weekend.

The members agreed to advertise the event in the Focus covering two pages and the CDO will provide material to the Focus.

RESOLVED:

The CDO would continue to identify other events across the week and report on final progress at the next meeting.

The CDO would submit a 1-page poster to the Focus by 8 May 2023.

12 CALENDER OF EVENTS

Members noted that Heather Coppock was willing to present a report to the Working Party on potential town-wide events so that the Working Party could decide which were appropriate for inclusion on the Events Calendar.

The working Group noted the "at a glance calendar" which set out all the known events for 2023. It was felt this was useful layout for the website, however the Working Group would currently prefer to remain with the "purple" layout document.

LEDBURY CARNIVAL BANK HOLIDAY MONDAY 28 AUGUST 2023

(1) Theme: 'Countryside Fun' to include all aspects of Herefordshire rural life.

The organisers hope the theme will encourage many local groups and community organisations to get involved, either by having a stall, entering the procession, creating a window display, or helping with funding (advertising in the programme, sponsorship, raffle prizes etc). Details are in the course of being sent to local groups and businesses.

- (2) Entertainment: The booking of entertainment both music to appeal to adults and activities for children is almost complete. The 'headline act' will be 'Front Runner' again, as for 2022. They were very popular and held the crowds.
- (3) Procession: Clubs and groups in Ledbury are in the process of being contacted to invite them to join the carnival procession. This has been quite fruitful to date. The proposal to include a 'best dressed mobility scooter' element in the procession has been very well received.

We are aiming for this to be as colourful and varied as possible and would like as many groups and individuals as possible to participate.

(4) Carnival Princess/Prince: Judging date has been set as Saturday 20 May 2023, 12.00 noon at the British Legion. The Competition is now open to 'Prince' as well.

Although a 'thank you event' has been held for the outgoing Princess and Attendants they are still very much in place and are available for all aspects of the forthcoming Coronation celebrations.

The Association are always very keen for them all to be involved as much as possible in community events.

Trying to organise the presence of the new incumbents on Community Day.

(5) Stalls and Fair: Booking underway. Aiming to have as much variety as possible. As far as possible, everything will be concentrated on the High Street and any activities etc. which cannot be accommodate here will be situated around The Barn in St Katherines to maximise the footfall for participants.

Fairground activity will be around Bye Street as before.

Possibility of Dog Show and Classic Cars in St Katherines.

(6) Security and Traffic Management: Have obtained 3 quotations. Will need to make a decision at next Carnival Meeting on 17 May 2023. All quotations are much higher than the Committee had anticipated.

Contacting BBLP Highways re road closures.

Fiona Miles has now left who was a very useful named contact. Now a more generic contact.

(7) Funding: Applications in the course of being made. Fundraising will be a big focus for the Committee this year. The Carnival costs approximately £16,000 to run each year. It is Ledbury's largest community event, attracting approximately 4,000 people to enjoy a fun-filled day of entertainment, largely free of charge. A significant and essential part of the cost is Event Management for the security and safety of the procession along the route and the maintenance of road closures.

The Association are very grateful for the on-going support from Ledbury Town Council.

The Association are planning to set up a 'Go Fund Me' page this year, for the first time. This will hopefully help to raise more awareness.

(8) Publicity/Raising Awareness: Articles are being submitted to the Ledbury Reporter on a regular basis.

The Carnival has a Facebook Page and Website and are keen to promote the event as far as possible. Work will be commencing on the Programme soon.

Very keen to work with the Town Council to promote the event via their channels.

Will try to have some presence on Community Day.

(9) Secretary and Other Volunteers: The post of Secretary is still vacant. The Association are keen to encourage as many volunteers as possible, especially to assist with stewarding and setting up on the Day.

CORONATION CELEBRATION EVENT - FEEDBACK

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update the Members of the Events Working Party as to the lessons learned from the Coronation Celebration event, which was held on Monday, 8 May 2023 in Ledbury High Street.

Detailed Information

Officers put out a call to the residents of Ledbury to craft some reusable bunting which was to be hung around the town. The response for the bunting was excellent and enough bunting was received to decorate the Market House and Church Lane.

Ledbury Town Council created an event which encompassed food vendors, live entertainment, traditional games, Morris Dancers, a fun dog show and a free craft area and competitions.

The traditional games proved to be hugely popular with the attendees at the event, as was the entertainment with a seating area created in the High Street for residents to enjoy the day whilst having their meals.

The event began at 12.00pm and ended at 5.00pm, with the weather holding out to allow the full programme to go ahead.

Food Vendors

There were 6 food vendors in attendance, although one had technical issues and was unable to open. Having spoken to the traders who attended, they felt that it was a worthwhile event for them.

The road closure enabled Ledbury Town Council ('LTC') to plan a pedestrian zone within the area. This enabled people to utilise the provided seating area without fear of vehicles, as well as allowing the games to be set up within the road area and for the Market House to be used solely as a stage area for the entertainers.

LTC sought to include local traders to be part of the food vendors, with LDA meats and Corner House Café both taking up a pitch.

Entertainment

Entertainment for the event included 'Mirror Ball', an 8-piece band who was kindly sourced for LTC, So Xsighted Morris Dancers, Ledbury Brass Band and Ledbury Community Choir.

The entertainment and the games were well received by those who attended. Local businesses provided support for the event in the form of sponsorship monies, prizes and items to create the traditional games.

Business in general around Town

Many of the local cafe's chose to open on the day to take advantage of the footfall in the town centre. There have been no reports of issues in the area.

Lessons Learned

Whilst the feedback for this event has been extremely positive, both in person and online there are several things which would improve the experience for future events.

- The traditional games were sourced and built by the members of LTC office staff. For any future event where this level of commitment is required, volunteers should be sought to assist with this to ensure that LTC staff are able to complete their daily tasks alongside the extra work.
- 2. If an event of this nature should be held in future then vendors should be sought as soon as possible to ensure that a good choice is available to attendees.
- 3. LTC staff need to be given as much notice as possible to organise and man an event of this type.
- 4. Volunteers need to be sought at the earliest time in order that there is not so much expectation on the few who did help. It was noted that some of the volunteers did not show up at all or did not help for the designated time slots, which subsequently put strain on the rest of the team as they were then having to cover for the gaps. For many who did volunteer it was a long and tiring day with a lot of physical exertion at both the start and end of the day.
- 5. Music Acts whilst the band were well received, LTC would have a far wider choice of bands and musicians if this can be decided upon at an earlier date.

Recommendation

That Members of the Events Working Party note the contents of this report in particular the points regarding timescales.

HERITAGE OPEN DAYS - UPDATE

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update Members of the Events Working Party on the progress of the Heritage Open Days.

Detailed Information

Sealed Knot

Following the Events Working Party on Wednesday, 3rd May, the Community Development Officer contacted the Sealed Knot to provisionally book a 'regimental' event during Heritage Open Days. Unfortunately, the CDO was advised that larger events had already been booked and that it was not possible to have a re-enactment in Ledbury this year. The CDO is waiting for confirmation as to whether the sealed knot can provide educational visits as an alternative.

Proposal from Olly Roberts –medieval combat (Buhurt)

The CDO was contacted by Olly Roberts, a local resident who participates in a sport called 'Buhurt', who would like to discuss the potential of working with the Town Council during Heritage Open Days. Buhurt is a modern full contact fighting sport with steel blunt weapons characteristic for the Middle Ages. Armour and weapons have to follow regulations on historical authenticity and safety published on official Battle of the Nations website.

The CDO has invited Olly Roberts to the Events Working Party to discuss the possibility of a battle taking place in Ledbury on Saturday, 17 September 2023, during Heritage Open Days.




