19. GREAT BIG GREEN WEEK (GBGW) 8 - 16 JUNE 2024.

The CEO presented a feedback report from the week and the success of the range of events. Two of particular events to note were the National Food Conversation and the willow weaving workshops.

It was noted that the dates for 2025 have ben announced 7 June – 15 June 2025. It was agreed that it would be date for the events diary.

RESOLVED:

- 1. Thanks to the CEO and team for a successful co-ordination and delivery of events across the week.

20. ST KATHERINES SQUARE EVENTS

The CEO presented a report regarding the booking and use of The Square. The content of which referred to the requirement to book to avoid conflict between different groups and also the proposed costs to be charged to groups and the Town Council.

The Working Party, fully supported the approach of the Environment & Leisure Committee, expressing its disappointment in Herefordshire Council's approach to charging for use of the area.

It was also noted that Herefordshire Council had been made aware of the lack of electricity to the area. The Working Party also noted that without resolution on charging and the electrical supply, usage of this valuable area would be limited.

RESOLVED:

The report be noted, and that Town Clerk would continue to investigate the charging for use of the St Katherine's Square.

21. HERITAGE OPEN DAYS (HODS) 6 – 15 SEPTEMBER 2024

The CEO presented a brief progress report on the preparations underway for HODS.

It was noted that individual organisations had to register their event(s) on the national HODS website by 8 August 2024.

The Working Party supported the creation of the town brochure and oral trail, via QR codes as set out in the CEO's report. This would mean that if certain buildings were closed then visitors could still find out details of the history and significance of the building. The CEO had circulated a proforma to respective organisations to create a consistent oral format for development.

HODS promotional material is available through the national website. It was agreed that bunting should go up across the buildings after the Carnival between 28 – 30 August.

Leaflets (800) would be printed in house, unless a reasonable printing cost could be achieved elsewhere.

RESOLVED

- 1. The CEO would work with organisations to create oral info for the QR codes for respective buildings.
- 2. The CEO would advise participating organisations that buntings etc would be going up from 28 August.
- 3. The CEO would arrange for printing of the local HODS leaflet.

22. CHRISTMAS LIGHT SWITCH ON EVENT - 24 NOVEMBER 2024

The CEO presented a progress report on preparations for the Christmas Light switch on. It was noted that a grant which was match funded by the Council had been awarded. The Working Party supported the recommendation of the creation of a Task & Finish Group to deliver the event.

Santa's Grotto would be in place again with a combination of individually booked slots and also booking slots for groups for reading.

HERITAGE OPEN DAYS - VISITOR NUMBERS

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update Members of the Events Working on the Heritage Open Days event that took place in September 2024.

Detailed Information

14 Venues in and around Ledbury opened their doors from 6 September 2024 to 15 September 2024, offering free tours and activities to celebrate Ledbury's history.

Feedback from Residents and organisers:

- 1. The Town Council Office recently received positive feedback from a local resident who visited the chapel on New Street. Both the Community Engagement Officer and Receptionist assisted the resident in locating the graves of family members buried in the cemetery, something that would have been nearly impossible without the old burial records and plot boards. The CEO has invited the resident to write an article for the Town Council's newsletter, sharing how, during HODS 2024, she was able to trace her ancestors at the cemetery.
- 2. From Tim Keyes Organiser at the Clock Tower. We had around 60 80 visitors to our tower exhibition during the HOD period, and 6 people signed up for the scheduled tower tour on 15th September. We had a lovely email from one of the couples who attended:

"Gill and I thought we were just going to go up the tower for a looksee this afternoon. In the event we were treated to something quite exceptional! I've always marvelled at the sound of church bells and now I know just how much ingenuity and dedication goes into it. Thank you for a memorable afternoon".

I think the brochure was excellent – well done for your work on this. I think people did like to have a paper version as well as online access.

Budget

A total of £490 was spent on printing 700 brochures. This amount does not include the delivery costs for brochures sent to organisations outside of Ledbury (those beyond walking distance).

As in previous years, the officers prepared the HODS brochure. To save both time and costs, it was agreed that the brochure would be printed externally. CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SWITCH-ON EVENT 2024

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to update Members of the Events Working Party in respect to the status of the plans for the Christmas Lights Switch-On event, which is being held on Sunday, 24 November 2024 in Ledbury High Street.

Detailed Information

The preparations for the Light Switch-On event on 24 November are progressing well. Over 30 traders have been secured, with a target of reaching 40 by the event date. Mr. Wilson's Second Liners, a 6-piece New Orleans-style brass band performing 90s club classics, has been booked for the event - https://www.mrwilsons.org.uk/mr-wilsons-second-liners . Additionally, arrangements are being made in collaboration with the Morris dancers to hold an interactive Morris dancing workshop. The Community Brass Band has also been contacted and has expressed their willingness to perform on the evening, alongside the community choir.

The Community Hub has been contacted and encouraged to apply for a grant to run Santa's Grotto. The CEO is also working with Red Earth Arts to organise a crafts event for families, which will take place at St. Katherine's Hall or the Burgage Hall during the day.

Road Closure

The CEO has applied for the road closure necessary for the event; however, it is imperative to secure volunteers to assist with stewarding and implementing this plan effectively.

Sponsorship

In addition, the CEO has drafted a sponsorship letter and form, which will be sent to local businesses. The funds raised will go towards the event, providing free entertainment for families and supporting gifts for children in need in Ledbury, as in previous years. The letter will be sent out once the online events calendar has been completed, as it welcomes businesses to freely post their events.

Further Work

A Task and Finish Christmas Lights group is being considered for Tuesday, 8 October, at 12.00pm in the Town Council office. Members are invited to provide feedback on whether this date would be appropriate for their participation in finalising the Christmas Light Switch on Event plans.

Financial Implications

The Council have a budget of £6,500 for the Light Switch on Event, noting that £2,500 has been funded from the UKSPF Funding. Budget papers will be available at the Task and Finish Working Party.
