## Ledbury Town Council NDP

Ledbury Neighbourhood Development Plan – next consultation due in the new year

Ledbury Town Council would like to thank everyone who took time to fill in the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) questionnaires sent to all households in Ledbury earlier this year. Without your input, we would not be able to complete this revision to the Plan. We received nearly 1,000 forms back and they made very interesting reading. Your views have been analysed and collated and we have used the results, alongside findings from a number of background

studies, to draw up a draft new NDP document. The document is a revision to some parts of the existing NDP. The revisions focus on establishing a settlement boundary, locations for employment and sports facilities and protection of green space. Policies covering building design and sustainable design are also proposed.

The draft is currently being finalised and will be considered by the Town Council in early December, after which it will be scrutinised by Herefordshire Council to ensure compliance with national and local policy and planning documents before being approved for what is

known as the 'Regulation 14' version of the Plan. Following this we will consult local people again on the Plan. This time, Covid-19 allowing, we hope to have some physical, face-to-face consultation events where you can look at the proposals in detail,

ask us questions and give your views. The plan is to hold the consultation during January and February 2022, so keep an eye open for publicity about the events. Information and a questionnaire will also be available on-line. It is

planned to ensure consultation materials will be available to view in

the library and at the Council offices.

If you are struggling to feed yourself or your family we are here to help.

Ledbury Food Bank opened in 2012. We currently feed more than 50 family units from Ledbury and surrounding villages each month. Nobody should be hungry in our society although we know that more than 1.5 million people in this country rely on food banks.



Anyone who needs help feeding themselves or their family can just come along to St Katherine's Hall on a Wednesday or Friday between 10.00 and 12.00. We turn no one away, and we may be able to help in other ways as well. We have a contract with Citizens Advice to provide benefits advice and we have trained volunteers who can help with debt and housing problems or, if necessary, refer to organisations that can.

The increase in our work means that we are urgently looking for new premises. We have a large team of committed volunteers who help us without whom we could not carry out our work.

We are dependent on public donations of food and money as well as grants from public and private organisations.

## HerefordBID Investing in our City

The Hereford BID is run by Hereford BID Ltd; an independent not-for-profit company that is controlled by the private sector with between 12-15 volunteer board members directing and advising the company in accordance with the business plan.

Representing 500 businesses in the City Centre, The Bid will deliver the business plan for their 2nd term (2020-2025), and in doing so, identify, agree and deliver a timetable of schemes that will increase the appeal of our City, returning Hereford as a regional shopping and leisure destination, and importantly, a national tourist one too.

#### What is a BID?

Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) are a business led and controlled partnership covering a tightly defined geographic area that delivers an agreed set of services and projects. In reaching this point a BID will have set out in its business plan what it intends to do for that area.

#### Why do we need the BID?

Hereford has seen a gradual decline as a destination for consumers over the last 20 years; whilst other destinations have prospered with the help of professional destination management and marketing, in Hereford we have (for the most part) done nothing. Hereford needs professional destination management to restore it as a regional shopping and leisure destination as well as a national tourist one too.
