What does a Flood Warden do?

Flood Wardens are community volunteers who:

- Act as local points of contact during flood alerts and warnings.
- Help share information between residents, the Town Council, and emergency services.
- Check on vulnerable neighbours and assist with community preparedness.
- Monitor watercourses and report blockages or concerns.

No prior experience is necessary — full training and support will be provided. This is a rewarding way to make a real difference in your local area, helping to build resilience and protect Ledbury from the risks of flooding.

Local knowledge and community spirit are key to keeping Ledbury safe. We're looking for residents who care about their town and want to be part of a friendly, proactive team working to reduce the impact of flooding.
