

For our most up to date events and what's going on





The work of the Resources Committee is mainly concerned with matters connected with employed staff and therefore its activities have to be kept confidential because of their personal nature.

It meets less frequently than the other major committees at just 3-4 times a year, but there is, however, much constructive, and important work that the committee undertakes in these areas to ensure the smooth and harmonious functioning of the Council's obligations and activities on behalf of the residents of Ledbury, even if not obvious to the public.

One key innovation in the last council year was the appointment of a Community Development Officer. Other new staff who have joined us in the last year as a result of a governance review in 2020 and to help deliver on the corporate plan, are a Deputy Clerk, Accounts Administrator and Office Administrator. On the governance front we recently completed a special audit on the financial consequences of the judicial review of a few years ago, with some important lessons to learn but no 'smoking gun' of failings by the council that were not already in the public domain.

Environment & Leisure Update

The Committee's responsibilities include a wide variety of concerns from the physical infrastructure of the town to cultural events and activities. Including Events, Markets and Climate Change.

Our remit covers the Recreation Ground, including the Skateboard Park, the Children's play area, the 'half-dome' Shelter, the CCTV coverage of the area, and the routine maintenance and repair thereof. Vandalism has been a continuing problem, and liaison with the Police has been regular and constructive which is showing results.

The other significant 'green space' for which we are responsible is Dog Hill Wood, above the town to the east. The Woodland Management Plan has highlighted necessary improvements, and we have set in motion the restoration of some of the seating and the signage in this area.

The Cemetery Chapel has been opened for visitors at Christmas and on Mothering Sunday. A new contractor was engaged to install Christmas lights for the next three years. The first installation, for Christmas 2021, was not entirely satisfactory, though the contractor responded to our requests for rectification—and has submitted revised and extended plans for the next two years.

The Markets Working Party has sought to clarify and update the town's Charter Market regulations and has experimented with a Craft Market. Funding has been obtained, through the Welcome Back initiative, to purchase several gazebos which can be used to house Town Council stalls at town events and may also be made available to volunteer organisations and market traders. The Climate Change Working Party supported an event to coincide with the COP26 conference in Glasgow in November 2021. Several volunteer groups have been encouraged in tidying and clearing the Town Trail.

The E & L Committee is responsible for the town's War Memorial, though this has been such a complex and long-standing problem that its progress has essentially been taken over by the Full Council. At the time of writing a financial settlement appears to have been reached with the contractor who carried out the unsatisfactory restoration - and the Council is now proceeding with the preparation of a specification for rectification works, to be put out to tender as

soon as possible.

Economy and Tourism

The purpose of the Economy & Tourism Committee is to promote events and businesses which attract visitors to Led bury and boost the local economy; and develop programmes and actions to support local businesses and attract grants and inward investment.

We were able to identify twenty-three key objectives from the Council's Corporate Plan 2020-2022 that could reasonably be adopted by the committee, and it was agreed to concentrate the work of the Committee into three main area:

1.To promote the Charter market and other 'speciality markets' in the town.

2.To promote the work of the guides of the Painted Room, the custodians of other historic attractions and organisers of other cultural and community events. Part of this work is to replace the Tourist Information Centre in the Homend with firstly, one much enhanced TIC in the Reception area of the Council Offices; and secondly, when feasible with a second TIC in our iconic master's House as part of the development of the area at The Barn end of St Katherine's Car Park, adjacent to the master's House.

3.To look to the feasibility of building on the huge success of the Poetry Festival and further enhance Led bury as a festival destination. This work was begun and has since been subsumed into the work of the Events Working Group of the Environment and Leisure Committee.

To this was added a fourth workstream as two funds from Central Government were released by Herefordshire Council to Parish and Town Councils. The two funds were the Welcome Back Fund and the Great Places to Visit fund. Looking forward, there remains significant challenges to properly co-ordinating the mission and work of our community organisations; to harnessing the Herculean effort of so many individual members of our community and particularly those who aspire to work with our young people.

Finance, Policy & General Purpose

I am proud of the accomplishments of the Finance, Policy and General Purposes committee in the past year, as we continue to emerge from the pandemic, into a more normal state of affairs, and continue to modernise our finances and governance, to put the council on steady footing going forward. I would like to thank the staff, in particular the indispensable Angie Price, for their unwavering hard work in support of the committee.

This year, we continued updating the Council's financial agreements with outside bodies, most notably the mortuary lease. We continued to modernise our policies for a more efficient and worker friendly council. We passed a budget whose precept rise is well below inflation, and below the council tax rise from Herefordshire Council. I would like to thank my fellow councillors, in particular Cllrs. Harvey, Howells, Bradford and Sinclair, who contributed to the Budget Monitoring meeting where the budget's final form was determined. In summation, the last year has been a productive one for the finance, policy and general purposes committee. I wish my successor in the chair all the best in continuing to advance all of these ongoing projects for the benefit of Ledbury.

Planning Committee

At the beginning of this current year the Ledbury Town Council standing committee structure was changed, and in particular, what was the Economic Development Planning Committee (ED&P) became the Planning Committee which now deals with Planning applictions, and Transport while economic development activities have been moved to other or new standing committees.

This last year has seen some movement on the major applications affecting the town but no new major applications. These include:

Bloor Homes, Bovis, Barrats Phase 2, 64 Bed Care Home, Full Pitcher and Pugh's old auction centre site.

Ledbury's Neighbourhood Development Plan (LNDP)

The development of the LNDP has been and continues to be a huge effort and has been making good progress.

The timescale imoving forward is currently evaluating the regulation 14 public consultation - The final draft WILL go to Full Council in May - The regulation 16 stage will be reached in June - at this stage the LNDP has some good legal power - Following consultation with Herefordshire Council the plan should go for examination in September - We hope to have it in place by January 2023.



If you are struggling to feed yourself or your family we are here to help.

Ledbury Food Bank opened in 2012. We currently feed more than 50 family units from Ledbury and surrounding villages each month. Nobody should be hungry in our society although we know that more than 1.5 million people in this country rely on food banks.



Anyone who needs help feeding themselves or their family can just come along to St Katherine's Hall on a Wednesday or Friday between 10.00 and 12.00. We turn no one away, and we may be able to help in other ways as well. We have a contract with Citizens Advice to provide benefits advice and we have trained volunteers who can help with debt and housing problems or, if necessary, refer to organisations that can.

The increase in our work means that we are urgently looking for new premises. We have a large team of committed volunteers who help us without whom we could not carry out our work.

We are dependent on public donations of food and money as well as grants from public and private organisations.
