Hvoss and Vennture launches amazing new project to support local communities



Hvoss, Herefordshire's independent local infrastructure support and development charity, is delighted to have been awarded £628,224 through the UK Community Renewal Fund, a UK government programme 2021-22. The programme aims to support people and communities most in need across the UK to run pilot programmes and new approaches to prepare for the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, as part of the government's Levelling Up initiative. It invests in skills, local business, supporting people with skills and into or closer to employment and community and place.

Hvoss is working in partnership with Vennture on this project. The project aims to reach and engage people whose voice is not often heard and/or who are isolated, including younger people, those who live in rural areas or those who feel they have few opportunities.

Training sessions available

There are two Trauma Informed training sessions being delivered by the Nelson Trust, 'Trauma Informed Approaches' (TIA) and 'Trauma Informed Wellbeing and Resilience' (WRS). The sessions are all day (9am to 4.30pm) at the Town Hall in Hereford and there are a variety of dates available. It is recommended that both modules are attended.

The training is CPD accredited and is designed for statutory, third sector (voluntary and community groups), and social and health care professionals.

The modules will provide a clear understanding of working in a Trauma Informed way by helping you to:

- Understand and explore the dynamics of trauma and its impact
- Implement Trauma informed practice in day to day service delivery
- Explore the impact of stress and stress management when delivering trauma informed support
- Develop ways to self-care and build resilience
