Did you know...Every household in Herefordshire can now apply for a **free** prepaid card, loaded with £15 to spend locally with our local businesses?

The initiative is part of Herefordshire Council's Shop Local campaign, which is supporting the county's economy by encouraging residents to spend their money with local producers, retailers and shopkeepers, whenever possible, helping our local communities survive and thrive.

You can apply for your card (one per household) via the <u>council's website</u>, until 31 January 2022.



Helping support more vulnerable families this Christmas

During the Christmas holidays, Herefordshire children aged 5 to 16, who receive benefit related free school meals, can once again participate in our free countywide Holiday Club Programme.

The programme offers over 1,000 places with a fantastic range of exciting indoor and outdoor activities, including arts, crafts, dance, boxing, circus skills, a Winter Wonderland Christmas party and much more!

Eligible children will be able to book up to 16 hours of free activities throughout the Christmas holidays, along with receiving a free healthy meal during each session.

If your child is eligible or you know a local family which is, it's not too late to book, as places are still available. You can book online today at www.talkcommunity.org/holidayactivities (all places are allocated on a first come, first served basis).

The Herefordshire Holiday Club Programme forms part of the Government's <u>Holiday Activities and Food Programme</u>, which is funded by the Department for Education.



Free online guide to help residents stay steady this winter

Winter is well and truly upon us once more, so there's never been a better time to take a look at our fantastic (and free!) falls prevention guide.

The online guide, which is full of information, top tips and short films, is a great way to help more people reduce their risk of falling, especially as they get older. It can also help people stay healthy, active and independent for longer, along with giving families additional support to help older loved ones.

Our top five tips for staying steady and preventing a fall, are...

- 1) Stay active, eat well and keep hydrated
- 2) Remove trip hazards in your home and garden
- 3) Always wear well fitted footwear
- 4) Be aware of raised shop doorways, pavement changes and uneven surfaces
- 5) Regularly review your medication and have your eyes and ears tested

Commissioner's Community Fund open to all parish councils

A one-off payment is now available to support vulnerable residents and families

Anyone living in a low income household, which receives Universal Credit, can now apply for a one-off payment of £60 to help with food, energy and other essential costs.

The payment is available through Herefordshire Council, which has been allocated over £1million by the government, as part of a new Household Support Fund to help vulnerable people and families this winter.

Interested in becoming an interpreter in Herefordshire?

If you, or anyone you know, would like to take the first steps towards becoming an interpreter in Herefordshire, but have done no training, then this course is perfect for you!

The Herefordshire Language Network is offering an unaccredited Foundation Training for Interpreters course, starting virtually in January 2022. Completing the training could lead to

paid work in the county, and all languages are welcome, no matter how rare or common you think they are.

The network currently provides interpreters and translators for around 350 assignments every month, covering public services, schools and voluntary organisations in Herefordshire. If that's something you'd like to get involved with and use your language skills, then sign up today!
