53. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

54. NOTES OF A MEETING OF THE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT WORKING PARTY HELD ON 15 SEPTEMBER 2020

RESOLVED: That the notes of the meeting of the Traffic Management Working Party held on 15 September 2020 be received as a correct record.

MABELS FURLONG & PARKWAY 55.

Members were provided with submissions and survey update on Mabel's Furlong and Parkway.

Councillor Howells suggested exploring the traffic regulation documents on gateways and that the council subsequently apply for a gateway at parkway. He advised members that a SID is more likely to be installed if there is street furniture. Councillor Bannister suggested that the Clerk investigate what data the SID provides for the next meeting of Traffic Management working Party.

Members asked whether it would be possible to provide a list of the Traffic Regulation orders in Ledbury. The Clerk advised that she would contact Graham Hornsby for the list for the next meeting.

The Town Clerk felt that the submissions survey on Mabels Furlong was difficult to read and advised that she would arrange for staff to present the survey similar to the parkway survey on page 416.

Members agreed to make a recommendation to the Economic Development and Planning Committee to increase the Traffic Management Working Party budget for a joint Traffic Management Order.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Town Clerk contact Graham Hornsby for the list of Traffic Regulation orders in Ledbury for the next TMWP meeting.
- That the Clerk investigate the data that a SID provides and update members accordingly.
- 3. That the Clerk arrange for the submissions and survey data on Mabel Furlong to be presented similar to the Parkway survey.
- 4. That a RECOMMENDATION be sent to the Economic Development and Planning Committee to increase the Traffic Management Working Party budget 2021/22 by £12,000 to allow for a combined Traffic Management Order.

The Clerk advised members that she had purchased two speed indicators for Ledbury and that they should be installed imminently. However, she had not received an update on the SID for the Hereford Road as of yet.

RESOLVED: That the update on speed indicators be received and noted.



LTC TMWP Parkway Resident Survey March 2019

It is not only the additoinal housing in Ledbury that will cause us issues with traffic, but also traffice from hew housing in Hereford, which will be travelling to the M50. The road is not fit for purpose.

The sight lines are very poor travelling through Parkway from all directions. This adds to the problems with speeding.

It is very dangerous and difficult to cross the road now as a pedestrian, it will be impossible with the additional traffic. We may need a pedestrian crossing or three.

I have to reverse off the highway to access my property by car. Turning to cross the road to reverse onto my drive is very dangerous due to poor visibility near to the Woolpitts corner / turning and also from a bend in the road by the garage.

You cannot see at all to cross the road from the houses opposite the Woolpits turning you just haee to wait and listen. This is not safe

Please visit Parkway and we will show you

If the speed is reduced to 30mph we do not want more housing in Parkway either.

I would like my daughter to walk from John Masefield School but the speed of the traffic is horrendous, especially large lorries.

The Parkway needs to be kept free of overhanging branches and street lighting would be most welcome.

Yes please for 30mph limit, gates and electronic reminders to speeding motorists.

Excellent idea - lighting also. It is very dangerous at night and lighting will help to make motorists aware that they are passing through a residential area.

Could we also receive copies of the Ledbury Focus Magazine this has been complained about before but nothing has happened.

When are we going to see something done about the non-existent path between Parkway and Ledbury? I am sick of having to clean muddy school shoes.

Maintenance of any planting aorund 'gates' will go hand in hand with a reduction in speed - 30mph limit needed. It feels very dangerous walking along the paths with cars and lorries whistling past. Not sure if I would want to spend time at the side of the road maintaining these until there is substantial reduction in speed generally.

Police speed enforcement point often does not pick up the worst offenders as drivers warn others they are there and they naturally slow down to the bend in the road prior to the positioning of the

There needs to be work on the pedestrian 'pathway' from Parkway. Speed restrictions for traffic is essential as pedestrials cross the road frequently as the path is not continuous and narrow. Once the path ends and enters the wooded area it disappears - it is currently a muddy slippery quagmire, with no lighting. In heavy rainfall it is impossible for children walking to JMHS to walk on and they have to walk along the road.

Every year I have to contact Balfour Beatty to report it as overgrown and it can take many weeks for them to cear it. The path needs to be cleared and have a proper surface and lighting as it is unsafe.

We moved to Parkway last year so cannot comment on the increase in traffic, except that the traffic has increased nationally.

Part of the move was to get a darker night sky and even though we are not on the main road we would not welcome street lights. Many 30mph limits exist without street lights.

We would be happy to be part of a team to look after planters rovided that they are put in locations that do not upt us at risk. The footpaths are not continuous and not maintained.

Getting onto the main road from our properties takes a lot longer due to the volume of traffic coming through Parkway now, that's before the new properties on the bypass cause more people travelling through.

Walking into Ledbury is not so easy trying to cross the road is very dangerous. Drivers are not aware of us or the speed limit.

As we have now seen how effective narrowing of the carriageway has been at the new housing estate roundabout (chicane), we need to change the road layout at the bottom of the dip so that vehicles have to slow down, however as this will never happen, some alternatives are:

- 1. Remove the 50mph zone as this gives motorists the false impression that this will be the speed limit all through the vilalge.
- 2. White gates at entry and narrowing road markings as in page 76 of the Highway Code.
- 3. Electronic speed indicators in both directions.
- 4. Use road markings at the edge of the road to narrow the effective width of the carriageway, I believe people will drive slower on a narrow lane, as on Page 62 of the Highway Code.
- 5. For no overtaking areas, change the centre double white lines to add hatched lines between them as in page 64 of the Highway Code.
- 6. For overtaking areas, add diagonal lines bounded by broken lines to the centre of the road as in page 62 of the Highway Code.
- 7. Install a full time Speed Camera.
- 8. Last Resort, Sleeping Policemen midway down each slope to the dip.

Hi Angie,

The delivery team are still waiting to receive the require sockets that the posts fit into! We have been experiencing delays with our suppliers due to the obvious reasons but I will keep chasing to hopefully have them come into our stores soon!

I have attached an example of the data that will be received after the SID deployments. Please note that the traffic count function cannot be deemed as accurate because the SIDs can't differentiate between vehicles. For example, when a vehicle drives past the SID it may flash the vehicles speed 3-4 times. The SID records this data as individual vehicles so you will usually find the traffic counts to be around 3-4 times larger than what would be expected and recorded when the ATC surveys were carried out.

Let me know if you have any questions on the data once you have had chance to absorb the information.

CONCERNS ON PARKING

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to advise Members of the Traffic management Working Party of correspondence received by a concerned resident in Ledbury

Correspondence Received

"I send you this email as matter of great concern. I refer to the car park at junction of Victoria and Oatleys Road, Ledbury.

Someone has removed the fencing at the entrance to the carpark and also the rear surrounding fencing. This now gives full access to motor vehicles to drive across the grass meadow/park. I have personally witnessed drivers, driving across to the rear entrances to their homes. There are currently tyre tracks across the grass proving this statement. I believe It is illegal and dangerous for these people to do this and of course dangerous to those using this area for recreational purposes.

The missing surrounding fencing has also given access directly to the canal/cycle path, sometimes known as the line. I have also noticed recently that several large trees have been cutdown near to the steps leading up to Woodleigh Road. The path is now rutted by vehicle wheel tracks. This in order to drive into the area and remove the large tree logs. Can you confirm that these trees were cutdown with approval of the Ledbury Council or an act of blatant illegal vandalism?

The bottom line on all this is to draw your attention to the fact, that the entire fence which should only allow entry into the carpark through a main entrance should be replaced as soon as possible and that this new fence should be a more solid structure in order to stop certain individuals from easily removing.

Your urgent attention to this issue would be appreciated."
