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HAVE YOUR SAY - THE REVISED LEDBURY NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN HAS REACHED THE NEXT CONSULTATION STAGE

After over 2 years of hard work, the revised draft version of Ledbury Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) 2022-2031 has now reached the Regulation 14 statutory consultation stage which started on Saturday 5th February and will run for six weeks until midnight on Saturday 19th March 2022 inclusive.

The revision edition of the Neighbourhood Plan is well timed as it will precede and help inform Herefordshire Council's revision of the Core Strategy (or the Local Plan) which last week prompted headlines in local papers that Ledbury may be required to build another 2,500 houses.

Although this was just media speculation, the new draft NDP proposes a 'Settlement Boundary' for the town which indicates where the community believe development should take place and where it should not. The aim is to produce a robust plan which expresses the wishes of the community and will guide the town's future development.

The revised plan has been drafted following an extensive public consultation based on an 'Issues and Options' questionnaire and held in the summer of 2021. Statutory consultees, the public, local businesses and stakeholders are now being invited to give their views on the new plan which has been formulated taking into account the feedback.

Since this is a statutory consultation, feedback can only be given on a specific Response Form which the Town Council would prefer was completed online if possible. The link for the online survey and other consultation information can be found on the Council's website on the Neighbourhood Development Plan page 'Updating our NDP' (www.ledburytowncouncil.gov.uk/en-gb/ndp-process).

Other options to respond include submitting via a QR code for mobile devices or by completing the Response Form on paper, copies of which can be collected from the Town Council offices during office hours or obtained by emailing the clerk as below.

The new plan can be read online on the Council's website on the Neighbourhood Development Plan page 'NDP Documents' (www.ledburytowncouncil.gov.uk/en-gb/ndp-documents). The plan and supporting documents can be found in Section 2.3. Hard copies can be seen at the Council offices, Church Lane and the Library throughout the six-week consultation period. Copies can also be borrowed from the Council Offices or emailed on request to the Clerk.

Following this consultation the responses will be collated and analysed. If necessary the document will be amended and then submitted to Herefordshire Council who will then undertake a final public consultation later in the year before putting the plan to formal examination by an independent inspector.

The main purpose of the Economy and Tourism Committee is to take forward the objectives of a more prosperous and visitor-attractive town; objectives set by the Town Council in the current Corporate Plan.

We aim to work with our many vibrant local groups and associations to ensure that new and improved services and amenities are in keeping with everything that makes Ledbury a great place to live.

Following consultation on the revised Neighborhood Development Plan, our challenge is to make best use of the opportunities the NDP affords for the development of existing and identified land for employment. Ledbury must not only be a great place to live but also a great place to set up business. How best can we make that happen?



LTC Planning Committee - Update for March 2022

The Planning Committee continues to be busy dealing with Planning, Access, Transport and Environmental issues arising from applications and on-going housing and commercial developments. This update is intended to bring Ledbury residents up-to-date with what is going on in and around the town.

1. Major Planning applications and on-going developments

As no-doubt most residents are aware, there are several major applications and developments underway in Ledbury amounting to over 1100 new dwellings in the town, well above the planned level of development set out in Herefordshire's Core Strategy.

i.Bloor Homes – 625 dwellings and 3 hectares of employment Land North of the viaduct -No:171532 In July and September 2021 respectively, the Biodiversity Enhancement and the Ecological Method proposals were rejected by Herefordshire planning. Works have begun with the erection of boundary fencing. No other works to be underway as yet and we have no further update.

ii.Barratt Homes south west of Leadon Way -a 275 dwelling development under way and due to be completed this year. A further application No: 212375/F for a second phase of 49 dwellings has been submitted to which LTC has strongly objected. No decision announced as yet.

iii.Bovis Homes 192482 – 140 Dwellings South of Leadon Way – No: 192482 Objected to by LTC but granted with conditions August 2020 – not yet started

iv.Connexus – Land behind Full Pitcher No: P194182/F – 93 dwellings, work now underway after long delay v.The Eades Properties Ltd. for a residential development on land at Land at H J Pugh Auctioneers, Market Street, Ledbury. No: P204577/F – 31 dwellings. Agreed development in principle but objected to this application. No decision as yet.

vi.Frontier Estates Ltd Land at St Matin's Way – No: P190568F A 64 Bed Nursing Home. Work almost completed.

2. Ledbury Investment Plan

Herefordshire Council (HC) has earmarked £20m for employment land, business space and capital projects in the county's five market towns. LTC have been working with HC's consultants to identify and prioritize projects in the town. The selected opportunities are;

a. Viaduct site – 3 hectares of employment allocation – Business incubator space b. Employment Land at Little Markle Rd. Heineken is offering land for commercial development

c. Parking and improved access at the railway station

d. Landscaping at St Katherine's car park

e. Relocation of Playing Fields

f. Shop front grant scheme

g. Conversion of LTC offices to Tourist destination

These projects are now under consideration by Hereford Council. It is anticipated that Hereford Council will work with the five market towns to establish an appropriate delivery mechanism.

3. Speed Indicator Devices (SID's)

TC has now been operating SIDs on three sites around the town for over 6 months. Sites at Parkway, The Southend (on the approach to John Masefield School), and on Hereford road are operated for one month in rotation. Here is a summary of the last 3 months of data from these sites.

Hereford Road

82% of vehicles at or below the speed limit
The Southend
78% of vehicles at or below the speed limit
Parkway

86% of vehicles at or below the speed limit

The data shows that the vast majority of motorists are obeying the speed limits at these locations.

4. Other Traffic Management Issues

i.Residents Parking

LTC have received a number of representations from residents with regard to the possibility of setting up resident parking zones. In particular, The Southend, Queens Court and Masefield Avenue are problem areas. Over the next few weeks LTC will be getting views of residents and delivering information about resident parking permits and enforcement issues. If we can get a consensus it should be possible to establish in these areas. LTC hope to work with residents to deliver residents parking.

ii. Yellow Lines

Double yellow lines have been requested in several areas. LTC is collecting data on all the possible locations where yellow lining could be installed.

iii. Speed Limits

Many residents have requested that a return to 20mph in some areas of the town would be beneficial, particularly near schools.

iv. Access

LTC is investigating the installation of dropped kerbs to allow better disabled access and await costing for an installation at Horse Lane Orchard.

There has been an increase of heavy vehicles using New Street. LTC is investigating the possibility of banning heavy vehicles from using this route.

Residents have also requested the possibility of reinstituting one-way traffic at various locations in the town including Woodleigh Road and parts of Orchard Rd

5. TROs (Traffic Regulation Orders)

Items ii, iii, and iv above fall under the control of Traffic regulation orders. Over the last two years LTC has been working to get a full list of these requested measures so that we can apply for a tranche of TROs. To this end LTC is making efforts to arrange a town walk round with the Locality Steward and the Police to assess the complete list and get our application underway as soon as possible. The TRO list will be published on the council website in March 2022 for public comment.

Environment & Leisure Update

Ledbury Town Council's Environment & Leisure Committee have been busy in the past few months bringing to fruition several projects. In particular, a lot of work has already taken place at the Recreational Ground by volunteers, Sustainable Ledbury, to cut back undergrowth and dense vegetation to open up spaces close to and surrounding the Shelter, Children's play area and skate park and this invaluable work will continue this year in and around the Town Centre. The children's play area will see a new piece of equipment in the summer in place of the hex swings and although the hex swings still remain popular, they will be moved to another location. Remedial works will take place in the Spring to improve the wet pour and grass matting surfaces around the play equipment. Plans are also being considered to revamp the skate park which will not only attract those with skate boards, but hopefully bicycles and scooters.

Once the weather improves, improvements and/or repairs to the existing wooden benches and metal seats will be underway in Dog Hill Woods as well as introducing some murals to bins with the support of local community groups. Two new benches will shortly be installed, one outside the Almshouses and the other outside the Old Cottage Hospital. Ledbury Town will be invited to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee at "Ledfest on the Rec" on Friday, 3 June 2022 at the Recreational Ground. Please keep an eye on our website for further details but we are hoping to encourage local bands, solo artists and up-coming new artists to participate in this exciting event which will be open to everyone.




